Bishops Call Vote a Grave Mistake and Serious Blow to Genuine Reform Say the Senate Should Not Support Bill in its Current Form Hope That House Provisions on Abortion Funding Prevail

The purpose of the meeting was to update the VCC on issues relating to some of Virginia's most vulnerable citizens and to share VAMI's and The Arc's legislative agendas for the upcoming 2010 General Assembly Session.
